The roles of Subject Ambassador and Student Librarian have been advertised to students this week. Students from all year groups who have a particular passion for a school subject or are enthusiastic consumers of the written word will be applying for these roles. In both subject ambassadors and librarians' pupils will be able to use their autonomy to actively contribute to the development and future of these departments. Students will spend at least half an hour a week being guided by staff to develop their own skills and make valuable contributions to the wider school, exploring topics from outside of the main curriculum. This opportunity is designed to allow students to explore their passions and learn new and exciting things in the field.
